Dr. JasonYeageannouncedhat 122studentshaveappliedfor the pre nursingprogramfor fall 2023. Henoted that GSUhada strongergroup of applicantsthan Marshallfor spring. Marshallindicated their interest in filling nine of the nursingspotson their campus with GSUstudentssince the GSUstudents scored higher points than the students at Marshall. Several students who did not get into Marshall's nursing program will be staying at GSUhowever, some will be switching their major

GrantsUpdate—Mr. DavidHutchisonannouncedthat Ms. LeslieMasonwill not be presentingdue to illness, so shewill provide an update at the next Boardmeeting. Davidshared PowerPoint included the following grant information:

StudentSupportServicesgrant is in yeartwo of five and serves 153 first generation, low incomestudents. AR Cgrant is in yeartwo of three and has provided cybersecurity upgrades in criminal justice and computer labs. GSUs partnering with Community and Technica Colleges and Career and Technica Center sto train students in cybersecurity.

Department of Education SIP grant is in year two of five and focuses on retention initiatives, software programs etc.

Federalappropriationswere received with the assistance of Senator Joe Manchinand Congress women Shelley Moore Capito. The appropriations will assist the University to purchase and resource equipment and technology modernization programs.

Other grants/fundingreceivedinclude grants for the nursing program; Maier Foundationscholarships EQT for LandResource and McGee Foundationscholarships.

Applicationswere recently submitted for Pioneer Network, BREC and USDAD istance Learning grants.
